

Robert Jones earned music degrees from the University of Windsor (1980) and the University of Western Ontario (1982). He also studied at the Royal School of Church Music in England and holds the Associateship and Choir Master diplomas from the Royal Canadian College of Organists. Active in the RCCO, Bob is currently the president of the Ottawa Centre. From 1982-99, Bob served as Director of Music at Central United Church in Sault Ste. Marie. He served as Organist and Choir Director at St. Luke's Anglican Church in Ottawa from 1999 until the end of 2022 when the church closed following a fire. He is now serving in a similar capacity at St. Stephen's Anglican Church in Ottawa's west end. Bob has played for the Saturday mass at St. Basil's Church (Ottawa) since 2000 and has been the conductor of the Seaway Valley Singers since 2004.

Accompanist **Margaret Whisselle** graduated from Queen's University in Kingston with a Bachelor of Music degree. She was the original Seaway Valley Singers' accompanist (1993-2000) and returned to us in September 2010! She is Organist/Choir Director at Lakeshore Drive United Church and Music Program Director for St. James Anglican Parish, both in Morrisburg. In addition to her private music students, Margaret teaches piano/vocal lessons at Rock My House Music Centre in Kemptville. She has been involved in local theatre for years, particularly noted for playing character roles with the Brockville Operatic Society. Margaret has recently been inducted into the Brockville and Area Performing Arts Hall of Fame!

Born in Sarnia, our Master of Ceremonies **Wendy Gibb** came to Iroquois to teach at Seaway District High School. She fell in love with the school, the kids and the community and never went back. She graduated from Trent University in ancient history and 20th century history, with special training in theatre, but she also taught media studies and law over the years. She has directed several theatrical productions over the years, including the Lions Club community plays at the Upper Canada Playhouse. Wendy also directed productions through St. James Anglican Church in Morrisburg, including a couple of comic murder mysteries and a Vicar of Dibley cabaret as fundraisers for the parish's outreach programs. Since retiring from teaching, she has been working for the Morrisburg Leader as a reporter, usually in the arts as well as a column called *Gibberish*.
