Bob has played for the Saturday mass at St. Basil's Church (Ottawa) since 2000 and has been the conductor of the Seaway Valley Singers since 2004.

Accompanist Margaret Whisselle graduated from Queen's University in Kingston with a Bachelor of Music degree. She was the original Seaway Valley Singers' accompanist (1993-2000) and returned to us in September 2010! She is Organist/Choir Director at Lakeshore Drive United Church and Music Program Director for St. James Anglican Parish, both in Morrisburg. In addition to her private music students, Margaret teaches piano/vocal lessons at Rock My House Music Centre in Kemptville. She has been involved in local theatre for years, particularly noted for playing character roles with the Brockville Operatic Society. Margaret has recently been inducted into the Brockville and Area Performing Arts Hall of Fame!

Born in Sarnia, our Master of Ceremonies **Wendy Gibb** came to Iroquois to teach at Seaway District High School. She fell in love with the school, the kids and the community and never went back. She graduated from Trent University in ancient history and 20th century history, with special training in theatre, but she also taught media studies and law over the years. She has directed several theatrical productions over the years, including the Lions Club community plays at the Upper Canada Playhouse.
